Teachers



Rita Ahonen mezzo-soprano, artist manager of Stretta Artists Management

Finnish mezzo-soprano Rita Ahonen looks back at almost 40 years of singing opera, having
sung her first roles while still a schoolgirl at the Conservatory opera studio in her hometown
Tampere. After singing at Finnish theatres in Kotka, Vaasa and Oulu she made her debut at the
Finnish National Opera in 1991 appearing there regularly until 2003. She debuted at the
Theater Basel in 2000 and was invited to join the ensemble where she stayed until 2016. She
has performed as a guest at the Stadttheater Bern, Royal Opera Stockholm and the Savonlinna

Opera Festival. Her repertoire comprises 70 roles ranging from baroque to contemporary operas, such as Arnalta, Messaggera, Juno/Ino, Dorabella, Carmen, Orlowsky, Baba the Turk, Flosshilde, Siegrune, Rosina and Berta, Feodor and Inn keeper, Olga, Larina and Filipyevna, Suzuki, Maddalena, Madame de Croissy, Clarice, Podtotshina, Bianca, Genéviève and roles in Finnish contemporary operas of I.Kuusisto, A.Sallinen, J.Kokkonen, E,Bergman, E.Rautavaara and T.Tuomela. Rita Ahonen graduated from the Sibelius-Academy in 1987 and undertook postgraduate studies at the Sankt Petersburg Conservatoire. An enthusiastic vocal pedagogue, she has worked as a singing teacher at the Theatre Academy in Helsinki and at the opera studio OperAvenir of Theater Basel.



Henning Lucius pianist

Pianist Henning Lucius studied with Peter-Jürgen Hofer, Gernot Kahl and Volker Banfield in Hamburg (concert examination degree) and with György Sabok and Shigeo Neriki in Broomington, USA. His musical influences are those he studied at masterclasses with, or has worked with, such as Ralf Gothóni, Dietrich Fischer-Diskau, Hartmut Höll, Christoph Eschenbach, Peter Feuchtwanger, Jörg Demus, Elisabeth Leonskaja, Rostislav Dubinsky, Peter Elkus, and

Aribert Reimann. He received many prizes and scholarships, including at Deutscher Musikwettbewerb (German national music competition).

Henning Lucius currently teaches at Lübeck Academy of Music, Rostock University of Music and Theater, and Hamburger Konservatorium.

He has been the accompanist of many masterclasses with renowned artists, including Judith Beckmann, Doreen Defeis, Helen Donath, Margreet Honig, Klesie Kelly, Edith Mathis, Christiane Oelze, Sibylla Rubens, Michaela Schuster, James Hooper, Siegfried Jerusalem, Thomas Quasthoff, Peter Schreier, Andrea Darzins (Viola), and Roman Nodel (Violin).

Meanwhile, he is a sought-after Lied accompanist and chamber musician.

Henning Lucius performs in Germany and abroad, including Japan, Argentina, and Iran. He has performed in many different ensembles, since 1995 in a piano duo with Matthias Veit, with the flutist Jürgen Franz, the soprano Graciela de Gydenfeldt, Frauke-Maria Thalacker, and the tenor Knut Schoch.

Other partners are Maxence Larrieu, Sabine Meyer, Christiane Oelze, and the Diotima Quartet (France). In collaboration with the singer/composer Steffen Wolf, "Ein deutscher Vaccai" (Breitkopf & Härtel) was published. In addition, he is a co-editor of Grand Trio op. 12 by Carl Loewe (F. Noetzel-Verlag, 2019) alongside Cord Garben.

Henning Lucius has performed under conductors Claus Bantzer, Thomas Hengelbrock, Günter Jena, Mathias Husmann,

Gerd Müller-Lorenz, and Rida Murtada.

For several years, he has worked as a musical director of the concert series Appen Classics. Radio recordings as well as TV- and CD-productions document his artistic career.

Edit Siegfried-Szabo soprano, founder of Supraleitung Methode
Edit Siegfried-Szabo obtained her diploma for early music in voice in 1990 at Schola Cantorum
Basiliensis in Basel. During her decade-long teaching and researching, she has developed the
Supraleitung Methode.

Her first book, "Supraleitung: der Weg zur Mitte", was published in 2017 under publisher BoD.de with the subtitle: "in 31 days, find strength and self-awareness by stabilizing the inner muscles". Her second book, "Das Schauspiel des Lebens" was published in 2018, also under publisher BoD.de.

Some sentences from both books has been set to music in classic-pop-crossover style and was published as an album "Das Schauspiel des Lebens" (with 10 songs) in February 2020.

She regularly publishes videos on Youtube on various topics such as voice and speech problems for teachers, managers and people with speech difficulties, as well as treatment option for permanent hoarseness and globe syndrome.

Her third book, "Bewusstes Singen (conscious singing)", with the subtitle: Practical Textbook of the Supraleitung Method on the Principle of Cause and Effect, has been published in December 2020 and drawing increasing attention.



Ville Enckelmann musical director of the opera studio, Deutsche Oper am Rhein Finnish conductor Vielle Enckelmann first studied Anglistics in Helsinki, before turning himself towards musical studies in Stockholm. After finishing his training as a Répétiteur at Operahögskolan, he was hired by the Royal Swedish Opera. Furthermore, he worked in festivals in Savolinna, Ystad, and Dalhalla, as well as at the European Union Opera in Baden-Baden and in Paris. In 2000, he became a Répétiteur at the Deutsche Oper am Rhein. Since the 2003/04

season he has also been active as a conductor, conducting Tschaikowsky's "Eugen Onegin", Humperdinck's "Hänsel und Gretel", Puccini's "Tosca", Offenbach's "Die schöne Helena" and Porter's "Kiss me, Kate". In Finnland, Ville Enckelmann conducted "Madame Butterfly" by Puccini in Theater Vaasa in 2005 and 2006. In the 2009/10 season, he held the position of musical director for "Das Schloß" after Franz Kafka's book of the same name, a co-production of Deutsche Oper am Rhein with Düsseldorfer Schauspielhaus and Tonhalle Düssendorf. In 2013, he conducted "Wachsfigurenkabinett (Waxworks)" by Hartmann with the opera studio. In 2017, Enckelmann conducted "Die Schneekönigin" by Marius Felix Lange in Opernhaus Düsseldorf, a production, which was later published as a DVD and became also available online on Operavision. Since the 2014/15 season, Ville Enckelmann is the musical director of the opera studio at Deutsche Oper am Rhein.
